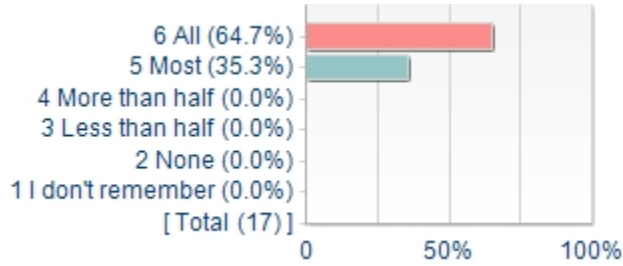

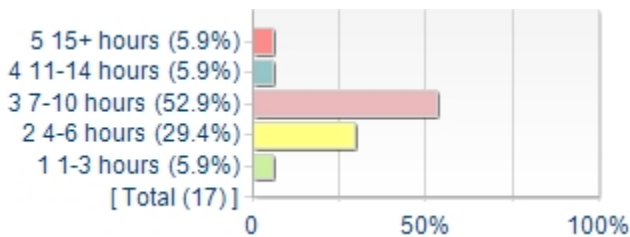

How many class sessions did you attend?



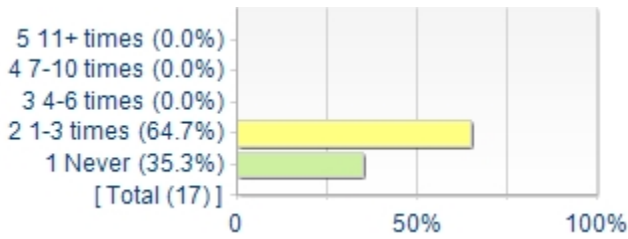

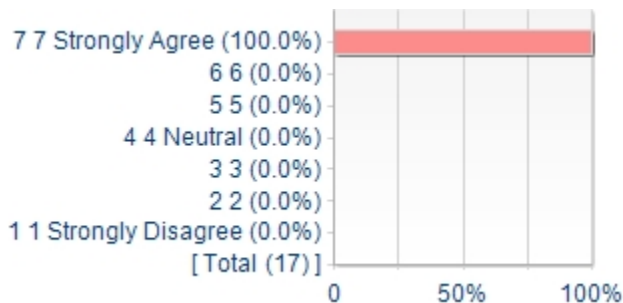
